

Introduction

Wildlife resources are key natural heritage that are a driver of local community livelihoods, and the environment and natural resources contribute over 50% of our GDP, with 90% of Kenya's electricity being generated from renewable natural resources. - 6. Opportunities for innovative economic growth
